Students who don't follow this procedure will have their item removed to be collected from the Deputy Principals at the end of the day. If a student continually doesn't wear correct uniform, parents will be contacted and there will be further consequences.

MT MAUNGANUI EXCHANGE





Watercare Services - Huia 1 Watermain - Upcoming work on Donovan Street and Boundary Road
