














Shinagawa Summer School Students Arrive

The appointments will be for 15 minutes. The preference is for the meetings to occur face to face, however bookings may take place online. All bookings will receive a Google Meet link. Your child's Hui mai teacher will ask which option you plan to use prior to the meeting.

Students are expected to attend these conferences with you, and lead the conversation.

The conference meeting will be focused around your child's progress to date this year, their engagement in learning and their next steps regarding their learning and achievement.

Appointments are with your child's Hui mai teacher. There are no individual appointments with subject teachers.

Subject teachers will have provided Hui mai teachers with information on student progress and engagement in each of their subjects, and this information will be shared verbally with parents and caregivers at the meetings. Should you wish to speak to a subject teacher, your child's Hui mai teacher will guide you in how to contact them.

It was wonderful to see all our Lynfield College students actively participating and being recognized during the prize-giving ceremony. Voices of Hope

Lynfield College has been lucky enough to be offered two free sessions with mental health advocates Jazz Thornton and Genevieve Mora who collectively run Voices of Hope Charity. Jazz was Young New Zealander of the year in 2021 and featured on Dancing with the Stars. She is also an accomplished film director. Genevieve is an author and together with Jazz they were named in 2023 Forbes 30 under 30. Recently, they have travelled to speak at the United Nations about mental health. Our senior students will be able to hear from these world famous speakers during their lifeskills lesson on Tuesday 27 August. Year 9 and 10 students will hear them during their midday 2 period on the same day.

Voices of Hope speakers share personal stories of their experiences with mental health challenges, seeking help, and the tools and strategies they used throughout their journey. Their talks focus on three primary areas:

Anti-Bullying: We are committed to promoting a community of kindness and respect, and our talks address the impact of bullying on mental health.

General Mental Health: Our speakers share their own personal lived experiences with mental health challenges, emphasising the importance of seeking help and the tools and strategies they used along their mental health journey.

Encouraging Help-Seeking Behaviours: We aim to normalise help-seeking behaviours and reduce the stigma surrounding mental health issues, encouraging students to reach out for support when needed.

ERO - Te Ara Huarau

Te Ara Huarau is the evaluation approach that the Education Review Office (ERO) is using in our school. This is a developmental approach to evaluation where ERO and our school work together over time rather than one off review that happened previously.

Te Ara Huarau is used in most English-medium state and state-integrated schools. ERO maintains a regular review programme to evaluate and report on the education and care of young people in the schools. Our school worked alongside ERO to write our Profile Report. This type of report will only happen once as part of our initial engagement with Te Ara Huarau. The profile report reflects our strategic goals and a shared evaluation focus on one or more areas that are important to us as we work together to improve outcomes for all our learners. ERO, like us, has a strong focus on equity and excellence.

Future reporting will show our progress and achievement towards meeting the goals we have set. Public reports like the Profile Report are published on ERO's website. A Board Assurance Report that shows how we are meeting regulatory and legislative Requirements has also been published. Included in our bundle of published reports is a Provision for International Students report.

Community Survey

We will send out the second of our community surveys shortly. The first survey was completed in Term 1, and since then we have implemented some initiatives based on the responses from you, students, and staff. These include:

- · More frequent communication about attendance and engagement, including the engagement reports
- More celebration of student successes in attendance, engagement, academic achievement and extra-curricular activities
- More frequent communication on social media about activities and successes
- New courses for 2025, including Samoan language and Year 13 UoA Engineering-focused courses in Calculus and Physics.
- Introducing the Schoolbridge app for easier communication between home and school.

SWIMMING SUCCESS – KEVIN ZHANG

The New Zealand Secondary Schools Swimming Meet was held recently at the Sir Owen Glenn National Aquatic Centre in Auckland. Lynfield College had one participant, Kevin Zhang, who distinguished himself with some excellent results.

Kevin won the 200m freestyle, the 100m and 200m Individual Medleys, and the 50m Random Medley Skins. He was second in the 100m freestyle and third in the 400m freestyle, 50m freestyle and 100m breaststroke. Kevin's many successes meant that Lynfield College, with one swimmer, was 13th out of 71 co-ed schools at the event.

Kevin has one more school event, the Auckland Secondary Schools Swimming Championships later this Term. If Kevin's swimming training programme allows for participation in this event, we expect further excellent results.
